If you're interested in doing something, here are some suggestions.

- 1. Familiarize yourself with Palestine. What is typically presented by U.S. corporate media is Israel's version of history and current events. Go beyond that.
- 2. Become familiar with the BDS Movement
- 3. Contact your federal politicians (President, Senators, Representative) by email and/or phone. Their contact information is on their web sites. Once you fill out their email form, it's saved, so repeated contacts are easy. The people of Palestine are being killed, starved and brutalized every day and our politicians need to be reminded that *our tax dollars* (\$4 billion/year and billions more in weapons) are the major funding source for the death and destruction. Tell them our tax dollars need to spent on WE THE PEOPLE vs. death and destruction.
- 4. Attend seminars and actions in support of Palestine. U.S. Campaign for Palestinian Rights: <a href="https://uscpr.org">https://uscpr.org</a>
- 5. Support individuals and groups that speak up for Palestine.

<u>If Not Now</u> is a group of young Jewish people who aren't afraid to condemn Israel.

## Obituary:

Albert J. Zaranka - Age 74 - Musical Director, Pianist, Educator Albert J. Zaranka passed away July 26, 2024, in North Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. Albert was born July 28, 1949, in Manchester, Connecticut. Albert was preceded in death by his parents, Anthony J. and Lottie E. (Mazurek) Zaranka; his brother, Victor Zaranka; his wife Ellen A. (Fadden) Zaranka: and sister-in-law Clara E. (Fadden) Coniff. Surviving Albert are two cousins, Philip Ledwith of Connecticut and Linda Ledwith of North Carolina; four brothers-in-law - Robert of Washington State; and Peter (Irene), Charles (Karen) and Philip (Cathy) of New York; sistersin-law - Mary (Gregory) Mayotte and Alice (Marta Sloper) Fadden, also of New York; and six nephews, five nieces, ten grandnieces and eight grandnephews. Albert was a graduate of the New England Conservatory of Music, Boston, Ma, in 1971 where he studied piano. While living in the New York City area, Albert played in off Broadway and local theater musical productions. Albert began his own studio, Studio One A in New York City (1978-1986); then opened Rivenoak Studio (1986-1998) while living in Fayetteville, NC; and continued teaching excelling adults and children at Woodcroft Piano Studio (1998-2015) in Durham, NC. There, Albert volunteered as an accompanist for students performing vocal auditions for college and performed in a trio of local professional musicians in Durham. Upon his retirement, Albert and his wife Ellen relocated to Fulton, NY to be near her family. Albert volunteered as an accompanist at churches in Central Square, NY as well as in North Myrtle Beach. They continued to winter in North Myrtle Beach. After Ellen's death, Albert moved full time to North Myrtle Beach. Albert was always entering on-line giveaways. After years of winning tee shirts, computers and televisions, he hit it big in 2015, winning the DIY® Network Blog Cabin GiveawayTM Grand Prize. Albert was an enthusiastic bicyclist and antique Citroen owner. Albert will be interred adjacent to his wife Ellen in the Fairdale Cemetery, Hannibal, NY at the convenience of the family.
