- 3. Contact your federal politicians (President, Senators, Representative) by email and/or phone. Their contact information is on their web sites. The people of Palestine are being killed, starved and brutalized every day and our politicians need to be reminded that our tax dollars (\$4 billion/year and billions more in weapons) are the major funding source for the death and destruction. Tell them our tax dollars need to spent on WE THE PEOPLE vs. death and destruction.
- 4. Attend seminars and actions in support of Palestine. U.S. Campaign for Palestinian Rights: <a href="https://uscpr.org">https://uscpr.org</a>
- 5. Support individuals and groups that speak up for Palestine.
